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
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Dear Bosco Catholic School System Community and Supporters,

- Emily Ownby is the BCSS K-12 Curriculum Coordinator/Instructional Coach. Her role is to support the academic program through curriculum review and utilization. She also is charged with aiding the principal in the development of strong instructional practices for all teachers.
- Tera Weber is the Director of DHS programs for BCSS. She is responsible for the operations of St. Joseph Preschool and the ABC after school program.

This division and delegation of responsibilities will allow each role to be able to focus on the area that he or she is responsible for. In years past, the two principals were responsible for all of those things. This new structure is a strong step forward to ensure that the school operates as efficiently and effectively as it can!

Dear IC& SJ and Don Bosco Catholic School families,

Hello! I'm Fr. Noah J. Diehm (though I tend to go by just "Fr. Diehm") and it's my pleasure to be your new pastor (of Immaculate Conception & St. Joseph parishes) and pastoral coordinator for both Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph elementary school and Don Bosco Catholic School. I've been a priest for 11 years as of this past June. I was ordained a transitional deacon on April 10th, 2010, at the St. Meinrad Seminary and School of Theology, where I attended seminary in southern Indiana, and was ordained a priest on June 25th, 2011, at the Cathedral of St. Raphael in Dubuque, along with my classmate Fr. Tony Kruse (pastor of Blessed Sacrament in Waterloo), by Archbishop Jerome Hanus. I come from a family of five, of which I'm the oldest and I have two younger sisters, Emily and Megan. Emily is a professor of Speech Pathology at St. Ambrose University and lives in Bettendorf and Megan works in the healthcare tech industry and lives in Chicago. My parents live in Dubuque and are both retired. Mom worked for many years at Hospice of Dubuque and dad retired from Mediacom.

When I was first ordained, I served as Associate Pastor for the Spires of Faith Cluster and the parishes in Dyersville, Earlville, Petersburg, New Vienna, and Worthington. In 2014, I became the pastor of the La Salle Pastorate and the parishes in Balltown, Holy Cross, Luxemburg, Rickardsville, and Sherrill (all in Dubuque County, north and east of my first assignment). I had served there for 8 years before being assigned here.

My family has roots around here since both mom and dad went to high school in Waterloo (dad at West and mom at Columbus) and my grandparents have lived in Waterloo for many decades. I had some familiarity with the assignment before I arrived, since Fr. Huber and I were in the same priest support group for the last 11 years and we would often rotate our meetings between Waterloo and Gilbertville. I've been in the rectory in Gilbertville many times before making it my permanent residence for the foreseeable future. I anticipate continuing to host my priest group here in Gilbertville

for as long I live here. Having known Fr. Huber for quite some time, I've heard about 8-man football and wrestling and a good number of the activities at the school and the parish. Though, to be sure, I have much more to learn.


As I think about the new school year and my new position as pastor, it's my hope that I can help all Catholics, and especially our students and their families, live as disciples of Jesus. That's one of my primary goals as a priest, to help Catholics know, love, and follow Jesus. Jesus is the reason for our school. He's the reason our parishes exist. He's the reason we come to Mass. He's the reason we're Catholic. Our whole life should be about coming into communion with the One who created us, Who redeemed us, and Who calls us to belong entirely to Him as fully initiated (baptized, confirmed, communicated) members of the Body of Christ, the Church. We're called to be Catholic, and to live as Catholics. Being Catholic isn't a part of who we are; instead, it's at the core of who we are. Our very being was changed at our baptism because God forever marked us as His own in the "ontological change" that happens in baptism. We are God's beloved children. He has looked upon us with love and called us His own.

I hope we can all work together, parents, teachers, parish members, and corporate parish members, to build something truly good, a truly excellent experience, not just of education, but of the faith as it's been lived by Catholics across two millennia of history. Here, in our parishes and in our school, we should learn not only the basics of education, but virtue and life skills and the lifestyle associated with being a Catholic. I hope that, together, we can achieve the dream that God has for our school, a dream of excellence, of growth in virtue, and of becoming disciples of Jesus the Lord. May we all work together to make the dream a reality!





- Preschool playground project is coming along as planned.


- New doors are ordered and will be installed this fall in Raymond along with new concrete outside the main entrance.

There are future projects that I will keep BCSS updated on as they start to happen. I'm just getting my feet wet right now and look forward to helping our system become even better than it is today!




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Protecting the Future of Bosco Catholic School System Ways to Give

Check: An outright gift of cash or check is one of the simplest ways to make a gift. Please make checks payable to Bosco Catholic School System, 405 16th Avenue, Bosco Catholic School System

Gifts of Grain: Can be donated from the current or previous year's harvest. A farmer should gift the grain directly to the school in order to save on taxes and deduct the cost of production.

Appreciated Securities: Gifts of marketable stocks, bonds, or mutual fund shares that have appreciated in value can have an immediate benefit for the BCSS and a favorable tax result for contributors.

Bequests: You may designate BCSS as a shared beneficiary on a life insurance policy. This can be done on a new or existing policy, an IRA annuity, employer group term insurance, or retirement plans. An outright bequest to BCSS may reduce the taxation on your estate, making the net

cost of your gift much less than its face value.



Deferred Giving: In recent years, many donors have chosen to make charitable gifts during their lifetime. A charitable remainder trust (CRT) is a perfect vehicle for some. Income from a CRT can be available to the donor for his/her life, and potentially to another beneficiary named

by the donor. Upon the death of the donor and any named beneficiary, the remainder passes to the school.



In–Kind Gifts: In-kind gifts are non-cash donations Gifts-in-kind include books, music, computers, construction materials and much more.

IRA Rollover: If you are 70.5 or older, you can use your IRA to support BCSS. Bosco Catholic School System

Making an IRA charitable rollover gift to us will lower the income and taxes from your IRA required minimum distribution (RMD) this year. Because we are taxexempt there is no tax paid on the transfer. Can direct up to \$100,000 per year.

Gifts from a Will or Trust: Designating us as a beneficiary of your will or trust is a simple way to commit to our cause, and it will not affect your cash flow during your lifetime

Endowments: A permanent fund separate from the general operating accounts. The income from this permanent educational endowment fund will be used for tuition reduction through direct school financial support.

The cost of educating a child for the 2021-2022 school year is as follows:

•	DBCHS (9-12) is \$12,693.53	\$4825/6300
•	IC•St. Joseph (K-5) is \$7,062.12	\$2950/4350
•	IC•St. Joseph (6-8) is \$7,062.12	\$3050/4350

This amount exceeds the tuition and parish investment received annually. The remaining amount of the budget must be supported by endowments and other third source income. 
