The Torch of Our Lady of Guadalupe Visiting Waterloo: This torch is traveling from the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City to the Cathedral of St. Patrick Catholic Church in New York City. NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY


Here at Don Bosco we have a chapter of the National Honor Society. Student members must be role models of the 4 Pillars: scholarship, leadership, character and service. Students are invited to apply after their first semester of Junior year if they have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher. They must also maintain the 3.5 or higher for the remaining 3 semesters of high school. The application requires that students identify their service and leadership activities throughout high school. Feedback on applicant's character is evaluated by the faculty, staff and coaches. Once students become members they are required to participate in leadership and service activities here at school, as a group, and to continue to be active in the community and beyond. Some of our projects in recent years have included: coordinating recycling efforts in the Don Bosco building, helping with the preschool field trip to the pumpkin patch, hosting the Veteran's Day Celebration here at school, hosting American Red Cross blood drives in November and April, and visiting the preschool to talk about Easter. Our first blood drive is coming up on Tuesday, November 7.

The National Honor Society will be hosting a blood drive in the high school gym on Tuesday, November 7. The drive will have appointments available from 1:00 to 6:00 PM. 

THE OLD **BOX TOPS CLIPS**



Traditional Box Tops clips are being phased out of production, but may continue to be found on many products throughout the store. You can still clip them and send them to school.

Every valid Box Tops clip is worth 10¢ for your school. Make sure each one has a clearly visible product acronym and expiration date.

THE NEW **BOX TOPS LABELS**



Eventually the Box Tops program will become digital-only. Participating brands are starting to change their packaging from a traditional Box Tops clip to the new Box Tops label.

If you see this label, use the new Box Tops app to scan your receipt. Box Tops are still worth 10¢ for your school. The app will find participating products purchased at any store and instantly add cash to your school's earnings online.
