


This year, we are working purposefully towards Lighthouse status. It is our "end in mind".

Drop off, pick up, parking information

When dropping your K-8 student(s) off in the morning, they can be dropped off at the front entrance of St. Mary Center, no earlier than 7:10am. If arriving after 7:20am, students should be dropped off at Entrance 6 and students will go directly to their classroom. All K-8 and high school students will be marked tardy if not in their classroom aby 7:30am! When picking your student up at the end of the day, you will need to park on the south and east side of Immaculate Conception Church. A teacher will walk students down to you.

Parking for all high school students will be:

- Knoll area at the north end of the plaza
- Paved parking lot, South of the high school
- Plaza parking spots open to students will be posted at the High School at the beginning of the school year.

Observance of yellow no parking lines and blue handicapped zone and other legal ordinances is required. In addition, parallel parking on the west side of the school (along the sidewalk) is prohibited during school hours.

1:1 Technology

We will again this year offer 1:1 technology for all students in grades 6-12. Last year we piloted a test run with our 6th-grade class with Chromebooks. After a year of data, we have decided to continue providing Chromebooks to our 6th-grade students, as well as our 7th, 8th, and 9th-grade classes. The device that the 8th and 9th-grade classes receive will follow them till the end of their Bosco curriculum career. Students in grades 10-12 will still be provided with their previous MacBook Air.

All returning 7th-12th graders and their parents will need to download the forms to be completed before students will be able to take the devices home for the year. Something to note for device insurance; the Worth Ave Group insurance will only cover MacBooks, as the Chromebooks have a one-time warranty per problem on each device for three years. These can be turned in on August 15th at back to business day or sent with the student to school on the first day to their advisor. The forms below can be found on our school website:

6th graders and new high school students will be given explicit, direct instruction regarding the 1:1 devices during the first few days of school.

Immunizations Incoming 7th & 12th Grade students

The Iowa Department of Public Health made changes to the Iowa Immunization law in school year 2017-2018 that are still in effect today. This change requires that, before school starts in the fall, all students entering 7th grade have both a Meningococcal vaccine and a Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis/whooping cough) booster and that all students entering 12th grade have a Meningococcal vaccine. The Tdap requirement has been in place since 2013/14 school year and requires a booster dose of Tetanus, Diphtheria and acellular Pertussis containing vaccine for students entering 7th grade, regardless of the interval since the last Tetanus/Diphtheria containing vaccine. Pertussis (whooping cough) is a very contagious disease that causes violent coughing fits that make it hard to breathe. Meningococcal disease is a life threatening illness that is caused by bacteria that infects the brain, blood, and spinal cord. It easily spreads in crowded settings and typically affects older teens and young adults. All students entering 7th and 12th grade must have proof of these vaccinations before school starts in August unless the student has a current Certificate of Immunization Exemption. There will be no grace/extension period for the implementation of this requirement.

If you have not already taken care of this, please schedule your student's immunizations soon.

John Deere Matching Fund

The John Deere Foundation Programs: Dollars for Doers and Matching Gifts include the Bosco Catholic School System as an eligible cause! Eligible employees are active US John Deere employees, full-time salaried and production employees and salaried employees in the Part-time Employee Program. Eligible employees can submit their match through their Employee Self Service (ESS) under the Power for Good program.

Dollars for Doers Program through the John Deere Foundation may provide a grant to any qualifying organization at which an employee volunteers at a rate of \$25 per hour with a max of \$1,000 per employee per year. The employee must be volunteering with the recipient organization at the time the grant is requested, not a year later. The program follows Deere & Company's fiscal year (1st of November to 31st of October). Dollars for Doers gifts must be submitted in the tool on or before the 31st of October, to be eligible, in accordance with the program guidelines. The requests can NOT exceed 40 hours at \$25 per hour for a maximum of \$1,000 total per employee per year.

Matching Gift Program encourages and rewards John Deere employees for their personal philanthropy and giving. The John Deere Foundation provides each eligible John Deere employee with up to \$1,000 each fiscal year to match their personal contributions to charitable organizations recognized with 501(c)(3) status by the US IRS and qualifying tax-exempt schools, subject to specific restrictions.
